MAIN POINT: Trust in the Lord who graciously provides all we need in Christ our substitute.

1. Surrender everything while trusting God. (v. 22:1-10)

“We must have a vision for a long process (lifelong), with a glorious end (the last day), that is actually going somewhere (today). Put those three together in the right way, and you have a practical theology that’s good to go and good for the going. - **David Powlison**

Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed the heir of all things, through whom also he created the world. - **Hebrews 1:1-2**

“The test asks Abraham to choose God over his own son and to trust God to fulfill the promises He has made, even when it appears he is putting to death the hope for those promises.” - **Belcher**

By faith Abraham, when he was tested, offered up Isaac, and he who had received the promises was in the act of offering up his only son, of whom it was said, "Through Isaac shall your offspring be named." He considered that God was able even to raise him from the dead, from which, figuratively speaking, he did receive him back. - **Hebrews 11:17-19**

2. Receive God’s substitute. (v. 22:11-19)

For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. - **John 3:16**

He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree... - **1 Peter 2:24**

For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. - **2 Corinthians 5:21**

What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us? 32 He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things? - **Romans 8:31-32**
