MAIN POINT: You are a creature who — despite suffering, evil, \sin , & death — is held completely secure in the grip of God's sovereign grace.

1. God's sovereign grace in the suffering of Joseph.

"The profundity of this reasoning comes into focus as we reflect on what Joseph does not say. He does not say that during a momentary lapse on God's part, Joseph's brothers sold him into slavery, but that God, being a superb chess player, turned the game around and in due course made Joseph prime minister of Egypt. Still less does he say that God's intention had been to send Joseph down to Egypt in a well-appointed chariot, but unfortunately Joseph's brothers rather mucked up the divine plan, forcing God to respond with clever countermoves to bring about his own good purposes." **D.A. "Rather, in the one event—the selling of Joseph into slavery—there were two parties, and two quite different intentions. On the one hand, Joseph's brothers acted, and their intentions were evil; on the other, God acted, and his intentions were good." **D.A. Carson**

2. God's sovereign grace in the suffering of the people of Israel.
